# Fight for the Faith!

Jude wanted his readers, and God wants us, to fight for a faith which has **already been clearly defined** and given to the whole church.

# Jude Verses 4-7



Fight because  
ungodly people  
snuck in.

Jude wanted his readers, and God wants us, to fight against people who **pervert grace** and **deny the authority of Jesus**.



# Fight against bad shepherds.

Jude wanted his readers, and God wants us, to fight against those who **rely on dreams** to justify sin and who are **destructive** instead of productive.



The fight ends with  
Jesus destroying the

**ungodly.** Jude reminds us that *Jesus will deliver justice*, but many do not believe and still pursue their own *wicked desires*.



We fight with  
different kinds of

**weapons.** Jude asks us to fight by *remembering* the word, *keeping* our love for God, and *showing mercy*.
