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Foundation Belief #3

A Christian understands and interprets PAIN differently in Christ! (see suffering, trials, afflictions, discipline, tribulation etc.)


We feel exonerated and have no tension, because after all, isn't



Plant "How do we engage" thoughts

Psychological Pain-definition Esther L. Meenvijkat & Sandra J. Weiss

Psychological pain may best be defined as a lasting unsustainable, and unpleasant feeling resulting from negative appraisal of an inability or deficiency of the self.

This negative self-appraisal is typically brought on by loss of someone or something, or failure to achieve something that is intimately linked to core psychological needs.



On Livingston's death in 1873, a worn copy of one of Spurgeon's printed sermons, "Accidents, Not Punishments," was found among Livingston's few possessions.




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The missionary had carried it with him throughout his travels in Africa.

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Spurgeons view of Pain and Suffering.

Spurgeon found that great suffering drew him closer to God. "I daresay the greatest earthly blessing that God can give to any of us is health, with the exception of sickness...

I am afraid that all the grace I have got of my comfortable and easy times and happy hours might almost lie on a penny. But the good I have received from my sorrows and pains and griefs is altogether incalculable...

Affliction is the best bit of furniture in my house, it is the best book in my library!"

Our Understanding of Good and how we view our relationship to him is essential!
